## Report on visit of Assistant Sub Inspector of Police for Anti-Ragging Awareness

Reporting Mechanisms: The ASI elucidated the available reporting mechanisms within the institute and through law enforcement. Contact details and procedures for reporting ragging incidents were shared with the students.

Preventive Measures: Suggestions and strategies for preventing ragging were discussed, encouraging a culture of mutual respect, awareness, and support among students.

Interaction and Questions and Answers: Finally, there was an interactive session where students and faculty members were encouraged to ask questions, seek clarifications, and share their experiences or concerns related to ragging.

The session concluded with a firm call-to-action from the ASI, urging everyone to play an active role in preventing and reporting any instances of ragging. The Associate Dean expressed their gratitude for the informative session and pledged their commitment to creating a safe and inclusive environment within the institution.
